Governor Spring Term Update for Families

Welcome to the first governor termly update for Hugh Joicey. We hope this provides families with an insight into the role of the governing body and how governors play an important part through support and holding the head teacher accountable to ensure the highest possible standard of education is delivered for your children.

School governors offer strategic guidance, rather than getting involved in the operational aspects of a school. This involves:

- Working with other governors to plan the school's strategic direction.
- Overseeing the school's financial performance, ensuring money is well-spent.
- Holding the headteacher or school leadership to account.

A school governor's relationship with the school's leadership team involves challenging existing processes to drive school improvement. School governors usually attend around six meetings per year.

We are very fortunate that we have a full complement of volunteers to support Hugh Joicey and ensure it thrives as a school for the community.

Structure and membership

The full governing body consists of 11 governors and meets once a term with the Head Teacher. The Primary Committees from the governing body are Teaching & Learning Committee and the Resources Committee which also meet termly.

Meetings this term

This has been a busy period, where in February chairs attended the virtual termly update for Chairs and Ex-Officios by the Joint Education Team of the Diocese. This is a helpful summary provided by the diocese's education team on a variety of topics that governors should be aware of. The most significant was the OFSTED Consultation. In March, the Spring full governing body meeting was held on 3rd March 2025 at Hugh Joicey.

Governors, were given a comprehensive Head Teacher report which covers an overview of school data on class progress, attendance, SEND and safeguarding. Mr Roberts and Miss Clark from pre-school were also able to provide a positive update on the new wraparound care system and the pre-school's plans and funding progress for their new extension.

The Resource Committee also met in March to go through the new budget scenarios to help plan ahead for the transition to Primary and ensure a new insurance policy was in place for the school's premises. The committee thank Mrs Morning and Mr Roberts for their updates and the work behind the scenes to ensure we deliver value for money.

Staffing Update

The governing body would like to take time to thank Lynda who is retiring from her administrative role within the school office for 24 years. She has served the school in more ways than her role was designed and played an important part of the daily running of the school and we wish her the very best in her retirement which is thoroughly deserved.

Governors supported Mr Roberts in recruiting a replacement for Lynda in March, a tall order indeed and one which was hotly contested. We would congratulate Mrs Cara Fairbairn on her successful application and warmly welcome her to the school's staffing community.

We look forward to meeting families on 1st April for a further update on our planning towards becoming a Primary School and will be able to welcome Diane Lakey (Head teacher at Ellingham) as a guest speaker.
